Guidelines for presentations CRE XIV Cambridge

Papers and posters

We kindly ask the speakers to accompany their papers with a digital powerpoint presentation in Microsoft format (i.e. 'ppt', 2000 or after). If you wish to use any alternative methods for the presentation of your research, e.g. transparencies, audio, video, etc. please contact the committee and discuss your requirements with us.

Moreover, please remember that if you are using any unusual fonts that are not easily 'decoded' on powepoint presentations (e.g. Hieroglyphs, hieroglyphic transliterations, Demotic, Ancient Greek, etc.), you should first embed them in the powerpoint presentation. Alternatively, you may export them as a picture and import the picture on the powerpoint instead.

Please save the powerpoint file on a USB and hand it to a committee member before the beginning of your panel. The committee member will transfer the file to the computer in the lecture room and the USB will be returned to you straight away. A good idea would be to name the file with your surname, as it will be faster to find on the computer screen.

Time is an issue during CRE XIV. Papers should not exceed 20 minutes in time. Experience has shown that a 20 minute paper equals about 2.500 words. We kindly ask you to respect the 20-minute time limit for each paper. Questions will be taken after the end of each paper.

Posters must be a standard A0 size, landscape or portrait, and should be given to a member of the committee when you register at the conference.

Your department will be able to advise you on how to produce your powerpoint presentation or poster.
